Advisory and Guidelines Regarding Verified Gross Mass

Dear Valued Customer,

The International Maritime Organization (IMO) will start enforcing the Safety of Life at Sea Convention (SOLAS) requirements regarding the verification of the gross mass of packed containers for the safety of the ship, workers both aboard ships and ashore, cargo and overall safety at sea.

This SOLAS requirement, to take effect from 1 July 2016, will mean that the loading of packed containers will be denied onto a ship unless the verified gross mass of the container has been communicated sufficiently in advance to the ship's master or his representative and the terminal representative in the preparation of the ship stowage plan. The shipper will be responsible for the verification of the gross mass of a packed container and stating the verified gross mass in the shipping document.
